There is magic in a magic room right here in Newport.

Sam Boyce has converted the conference room upstairs in his law office on Main Street into a wonderful world of magic, magic being Sam's hobby since he was a boy.

On a tour of the law office recently I was so captured by the magic room I asked for a return visit, I spent a delightful two hours visiting with Sam.

Most of the equipment in the room Sam has owned 40 to 50 years.

His passion for magic began for Sam Boyce when he was an 11 year old boy, living in Tuckerman and was given a Mysto Magic Set for his birthday.

Shows right away, I asked?

"On the front porch only at first," replied Sam, "but that summer Reagen Bowman, Morris' cousin, came to Newport to visit, he was two years older than I and he did magic really well and I became hooked on learning all about magic.

"Throughout high school we had a split term in Tuckerman, we

were out in September and part of October and five of us would take our magic show to assemblies in schools that were not out.

"The other students were Jestine Gray, J.T. Layton and Keith and Kern Kennedy, twins, all from Tuckerman. Twins are a valuable asset in a magic show.

"We sold our tickets for five and 10 cents and made a little money.

"I can do a show by myself, but it is better with a helper.

It was John Allen Magee, a professional magician who toured northeast Arkansas, who got Sam interested in belonging to the Internal Brotherhood of Magicians.

"I have always said that John's best trick was when he built up his father's business in Corning and sold it for several million dollars," laughed Sam.

"John had been a professional magician for 15 years when his dad died and John had to take over the family furniture business in Corning.

"As a sideline he started a picture framing business, he and his brother took the business to Pocahontas where they sold it for several million.

"Before John died he admitted that was his best trick, his widow still lives."

Sam's hobby lay dormant in his college years, but in 1954-55, when Sam was in the army in Germany, he saw some really good magicians perform, met some European magicians and bought a lot of good equipment he still has.

When Sam came home from the army he entered law school at Fayetteville.

"I did a few fraternity shows, but after my graduation I moved to Washington and worked for Wilbur Mills and stored all my magic equipment at my mother's home in Tuckerman."

I hope you will continue with Sam and me tomorrow.
