
You may remember we wrote about his show in last September's newsletter. VanBurch is a world-class magician who has purchased many of Doug Henning's illusions. Henning, as you know, has given up magic for other interests.

Co-starring in the new show at the Five Star Theatre is **Bobby Berosini** and his orangutans. He is the man who trained the orangutan for the movies 'Every Which Way but Loose' and 'Going Ape,' and many television shows.

Jim proposes that people who go leave about 8 am in order to arrive late morning. He is trying to arrange lunch with Kirby, before his 2 pm show. If that doesn't work, then he hopes Kirby will meet with us after the show (which lasts about 2 1/2 hours). Twelve have signed up so far.
