Schick begins new career as performing magician (?)

Newsletter editor <u>Dennis Schick</u> is a magic hobbyist, rather than a performer, he says. But that all changed recently when he was asked to give a repeat talk at the Searcy Rotary Club. Not wanting to give the same talk ("Hats Off to Newspapers") -- even though it had been four years earlier -- he decided to take advantage of the opportunity and create a new 30-minute show -- "<u>The Magic of Newspapers.</u>"

He used a mirror box to show how newspapers start with nothing every day and create multi-part publications; Clippo to show how long stories are edited; a mental prediction routine called "Tabloid;" "In the News," where clear water (hard work, or sweat) is poured into a folded newspaper, is rotated and the water pours out turned green (for money); and ending with Gene Anderson's "Torn and Restored Newspaper."

All went well in Searcy (45 people), and he repeated the show to the Newport Lion's Club last week (to about 25 people). It's amazing what a little practice will do.

We got to see some new performers in action and it's always fun to perform in front of family and friends.


We'll start earlier to find a place next year so it will be more convenient to more of you and have a larger crowd.
