Letter to Ring 29 members...and guests:

Dear fellow magician:

On <u>Friday, July 26</u>, <u>Bill Spooner</u>, past president of IBM and Director of Curriculum at the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction, <u>will present to our Ring</u>. Spooner has presented many magician lectures on magic history, misdirection and his "Magical Spoonerisms" lecture. He will be in Arkansas to make a presentation (there will be some magic) to our state's math and science teachers. I had Ring 29 in mind when I arranged for his talk to them.

Bill is an avid collector of magic of all types and is well versed in their performance. He has in his collection a lota vessel from a pre-Columbian tribe.

One of Bill's effects will be the "Snap Knot." He will cause a knot to appear in the middle of a rope held between his two outstretched hands. It will be a double knot and can be untied by a spectator. Bill originated this knot in 1954 and he has been amazing audiences and magicians ever since.

<u>Dai Vernon</u> saw Bill perform the "Snap Knot" at the Magic Castle in 1975. After the second performance Vernon said that he thought Bill was the only magician in the world who could perform this effect. Later, when Vernon visited North Carolina on his farewell lecture tour, he showed Bill that he, too, had mastered the technique.

We need to make sure Bill shows us this effect. He says that some people are able to perform it immediately and some take several months. Perhaps as a group effort some of us will succeed.

I've known Bill about 15 years and highly recommend him. In fact, he is the reason I am an IBM member.

I <u>strongly urge you to make a special effort</u> to come to this lecture, and to bring guests interested in magic. You and they won't be disappointed.


