# Magic in Las Vegas is featured in magazine

✓ The latest issue of the <u>Delta Airlines</u> inflight magazine, "<u>Sky</u>," has an article about the many magic shows in Las Vegas. There are several shows there featuring magic, and Ring member Scott Davis is going there in a few days to see many of them. We'll ask him to write us a report when he gets back.. The article tells a little about the following shows:

• Siegfried & Roy: Their slick show, at The Mirage, costs a whopping \$83.85, more than my first house monthly payment.

#### • Lance Burton: Master Magician:

At the Monte Carlo Resort, it costs \$34.95, and is a much better show and bargain, according to the author of the article.

#### • Nick Lewin's Comedy Magic:

An afternoon act by a magician from England, he does a lot of close-up magic. At Maxim, it costs from \$9.95 to \$12.95 to get in.

#### Caesars Magical Empire:

This new attraction is at (where else?) Caesars Palace. It's a multi-part adventure, including lunch or dinner, wizards and sorcerers, two theaters after you eat (one for large-scale illusions and the other for close-up magic).

This gem costs between \$67.50 and \$77.50. You had better auction off some of your unused magic to afford to go.

#### Showgirls of Magic:

Set in a theater which looks like a strip joint, the author says it is "cheesey, tacky and awful." At the Hotel San Remo, it only costs \$19.95.

#### • Spellbound.

Featured in this show is Mexico's leading illusionist, Joaquin Ayala. It costs \$29.95 and is at Harrah's Las Vegas.

It sounds like magic is blossoming all over in Las Vegas, and is part of the city's transformation from the long-held image as "Sin City," to a true family vacationland. If any of you go, please report back to the rest of us so we can know which shows to see and which ones to avoid.

## "Disillusionist" is featured at Tourism Conference

Billy Riggs, a professional magician, performed a 90-minute show as the concluding session of the Governor's Conference on Tourism, March 18 in Pine Bluff..

He billed himself as a "disillusionist," and spent most of the show telling people how and why they should give up the more-fun illusions of life and accept the disillusions (realities and the truth). He called his show "Grand Illusions."

To make his points, he performed a series of tricks, including the Torn and Restored Newspaper (at the beginning and also at the end), the Zig Zag Woman (using a guest from the audience), Cards with Changing Dots, the Invisible Deck, a Levitation (of a woman from the audience), and a series of predictions. Woven throughout the tricks were bits of humor and motivation.
