

Aldo is a renowned lecturer on Magic and has been nominated by The Academy of Magic Arts at the famous Magic Castle in Hollywood, California as lecturer of the year in 1994, 1995 and 1996. He is well known for his philosophy that "you don't have to break your fingers to wow an audience." His lectures, for the professional magician as well as the beginner, have been praised the world over and he is very much in demand.

♦ He is a prolific writer having published several books in many languages, including Spanish and German. His newest

book, What's Up Deck? was recently published by his company, Mamma Mia Magic, located in California. He is also the creator and manufacturer of many magic tricks sold in magic shops all over the world.


► Aldo speaks Italian, Spanish and French as well as English and can lecture in all four languages.
