The Kirby Van Burch Show -- A Review by Dennis

On the way back from a meeting in Central Missouri May 7, Jan and I stopped in Branson to see Kirby's new show in his new theater. Here is a rundown of the show, the theater and other thoughts:

Kirby's new theater is deceptive from the outside. It looks small. But it is on a hill and the seats are stacked almost as steep as in stadiums, to give everyone a great look at the stage. I wondered whether he was going to have to give up all the scenery and illusions which require a high, wide and deep stage. But upon entering it was obvious that he has a great arena for his show.

The new theater is one third the size of his last two, but it is still big. We were told it seats just over 900. His last theater is only two blocks away (where Melinda performed last year) and seated over 3,000. His first theater (Remington) was about that same size, way too big for smaller crowds and the intimacy for magic. We were there on a Friday night and the pre-vacation crowd was about 350, not bad for the time of year.

The lobby is rather small and I don't know where he is going to build a gift store, like he said he was going to. Right now he is using a small window area down front.

Work is still going on outside. He has most of the inside like he wants it. The ornamental outside decoration was supposed to be installed by the end of June, but he said there had been many construction delays since he bought the theater.

The show moved along nicely and was well received. Here is a rundown:

• The stage had a huge magic lamp sitting in

full view when people enter the theater. The music is mystical and sets the proper mood.

- · The opening features dancers and a genii in a chair which floats around the stage with the man singing about magic.
 - · Magician appears from a fire curtain
 - A girl-to-tiger illusion is a nice surprise.
 - Metamorphosis is smoothly performed;
 - Two girls cut in half, bodies switched
 - · A silver ball float and a levitation combo
 - · A girl in a trunk turns into a python.
 - · Two girls turn into a leopard
 - · Girl in box is twisted
 - · A water glass is suspended
 - · Walk through a plate glass mirror
 - Whiteboard prediction (Road Kill Cafe)
 - Bucket with ducks
 - Girl levitation on water columns
 - · Elevator appear
 - · Girl's body disappearance
 - · Pharoah throne leads to reappearance
 - · Three dry color sands from water bowl
 - · Person pushes through another person
 - Mystery of Oragami
 - Card trick prediction
 - Paperback book prediction
 - Appearing helicopter (finale)

Kirby told me he has two more major illusions being completed in California and he'll add them to the show soon. He has a comedian/ ventriloquist to break up the evening and he's very clever and mostly very funny.

Overall the show is very good, but even Kirby admitted it was a "work in progress." Jan and I noticed a minor flub here and there. but then we watch a lot of magic. He even opened by saying they were still working on the show. "Welcome to rehearsal," he said.

I highly recommend the show. Give us a progress report when you come back.
