Fox reruns exposure shows but they get low ratings

THE BAD NEWS is that Fox recently reran two of their four terrible "Magic's Biggest Secrets Revealed" shows. The good news is that #4 only garnered a 57th place (6.1 rating) and #3 was even lower, at 68th place (5.3), for the week. But the bad news is that those low ratings still account for a heck of a lot of people.

The rating is the percentage of the nation's estimated 101 million TV homes, and each ratings point represents about one million households.

PROFILE OF THE MONTH:

Jon Bucher is the subject of this month's member profile. He lives in Searcy and holds dual IBM memberships in Ring 29 as well as Ring 308. Jon is an April 19 product, born in Lincoln, Kansas. He is a graduate of ASU-Beebe with a major in Computer Systems Technology.

He is married to Susan Ann and their family consists of six children, four girls and two boys. They also have five grandchildren so ask him about them at your own peril.

Jon works for EDS in Little Rock, as a provider representative. He researches Medicaid billing problems; loads and teaches software programs; and speaks publicly.

As a teenager he found a book about magic in his school's library and tried some of the tricks. When they worked, he was hooked, and he's been at it ever since.

He learned his first real routine from Maurice Lowe, at Ring 47 in Wichita, KS, so he is one of Jon's heroes in magic. Also, he mentions Dick Oslund, a professional school magician performer, who mentored Jon. A third hero who he says he always looked up

to is Karrell Fox.

He lists as his interests in magic that he is a parttime performer, likes to and does teach magic, and is a magic collector, of figurines of magic clowns and magicians pulling rabbits out of hats.

Jon has many magic skills, including cards, ropes, money and coins, scarves, cups and balls, close-up, stage, show illusions and comedy magic.

His magic specialties include: Park bench scene (Jon and Susan in an 1890s music act with hand magic); Theater of Magic (banquet-type, 30-40 minute act with audience interaction); and Balloonatic: a balloon act about 30 minutes long.

His three most favorite magic tricks which he performs are: (1) The Dancing Hank; (2) Shooting a hole in a selected card; and (3) the production of a silk streamer from bare hands, coupled with the 20th Century Sock trick.

Jon is a regular attendee at Ring 29 meetings, and is an active performer in the Searcy area. Thanks for allowing us to get to know you a little better, Jon.
